I recently joined a Men's Small Group. I know, it doesn't make sense because I'm not a man. None the less, they graciously al-

lowed me to join them and it has been life-

giving and a highlight of my week. Now, I hope

you are wondering how hanging out with a bunch of men drinking water and eating snacks (I think we've

had jerky, cup-

cakes, crackers, sausage & cheese...our next grouping we will have brats & burgers, so it will be a real up-grade!) from 7-8:30 pm on Tuesday nights could be life changing.

This is the second (adult) Trinity Small Group I have been a part of, and what it has shown me is that I need a small group. I can survive without one, but I live better with one. Getting together with a handful of other people of faith is irreplaceable. I'm more aware of how God is active in my life and in the world when I'm engaging with other disciples intentionally. I had a small group leader say to me, "This is exactly what I need. I just didn't know I needed it." Yes!

That's my experience as well.

A small group is a great way to practice all things faith related. I've seen people in my small groups go from being unwilling

to pray out loud to leading us all in prayer. That's powerful! And it's personal to be prayed for by a friend. Sometimes we fumble



In this group, I've heard authentic and moving stories of how God has shown up in their lives. This has really impacted me. Hearing these stories helps me see more of how God works and also I get to see the love of God through my small group friends. We read the Bible and talk about it without there being right or wrong answers. Instead we let scripture help us see God's activity in our life.



■ Board of Worship

New Council Initiative

At our council retreat last year, we identified organizational structure and communication as the two biggest challenges hampering our ministry at Trinity Lutheran. Reviewing past council minutes and initiatives, we decided to start with two changes.

First, the chairperson of each board will now be the council representative for that board. We believe that this will improve the communication and the accountability between the boards and the council. This is not a new idea; we are implementing a motion that was passed by the council in 2006.

Second, we are asking Jody Doro to continue to serve on the board of education past his term limit to help test and evaluate how that board would operate under a committee structure. The board of education was selected

for the trial period as it is currently operating in a manner that most closely resembles the committee structure to be evaluated. The adjustments will be assessed by council on an ongoing basis during the evaluation period. This is our first attempt to bring a "Test and Learn" culture to Trinity, as identified and recommended by the Vision and Planning document developed in 2017.
