

Bible Study: The Final Week

I will be offering another Pastor led Bible Study I'm calling "The Final Week" that focuses on Jesus' final footsteps from what Christians call Palm Sunday through Good Friday. Our study is inspired by two books by Adam Hamilton—"24 *Hours that Changed the World,*" and "The Way: Walking in the Footsteps of Jesus."

This is a three week class **Thurs**days from 10:00am—11:00am on March 23, 30 and April 6. You can bring you own Bible or use one provided at church.

How much do you know about the final week of Jesus' life? For example, did you know that when Jesus rode into town on that first Palm Sunday this wasn't the only parade coming into town that day. Did you know that in one of the gospels when Jesus is being crucified another significant event was taking place at the same time that was part of the defining story of ancient Israel? Have you ever thought about what Jesus was up to on the days leading up to his crucifixion? The study will explore a variety of Bible passages about the events of this final week such as the ride into town on a donkey, cleansing the temple, the teaching Jesus did at the temple, the Last Supper, the trial and the crucifixion.

We will "visit" (through pictures) some the places Jesus went during his final week such as the Mount of Olives, the Garden of Gethsemane, the Temple Mount, the Kidron Valley, and the site of the crucifixion. This sightseeing will help us learn that often times the places mentioned in the gospels are key to telling the story. So we will learn a bit more about the geography.

The final class will be a more hands on learning time where we will experience a modified Seder Meal. I have found participating in this meal adds insight into the significance of what Jesus was doing as he made his way to the cross.

I hope you can join me for this study of the heart of our Christian faith.

One of the joys of a trip like this is the opportunity to invite & engage. I recently heard somebody say, "We aren't saved by going to church. We're saved by Jesus. But let's get together and hang out." I love that! We are saved by the cross. We are saved by grace through faith. We are saved! So let's get together and worship the one who saves. Let's stretch and grow together in faith. That's what a trip like this is all about.

Josh Schmitz is coming as the male adult leader (per our Child Protection Policy). He said "YES, this will be the most amazing trip ever! In the most beautiful place!"

He thinks he said "yes" to going with this amazing group on a trip. But he actually said "yes" to God calling him into this faith experience. And not just him, but all 11 of us. We are saying "yes" to God's call to pile into a van for 24 hours of driving (over 2 days). "Yes!" to God's call to live out in creation without our phones, showers, or Netflix. And "Yes!" to being open to Jesus in new ways.

I can't tell you what will happen over those 10 days on this Montana Adventure but I do know that the love and prayers of Trinity will be with us. And when we return, we will carry with us a new experience of Jesus and community.
