

HOMEBOUND VISITATION

In my first call, I served 3 congregations. I was young and figuring things out, and so I started by going to all the homes and care facilities to meet the people who weren't able to come to worship in person and had been placed on the Homebound List by the previous pastor.

I remember one woman that couldn't accept that I was a pastor. She just kept laughing and saying, "A woman pastor?" That was awkward, but she eventually sat with me and we shared in communion together. When I left she surprised me by saying, "Bye, Pastor!"

I remember a gentleman who was in hospice who hadn't spoken since he got back from the war. Other people spoke for him to tell me all that he had been through. He was a gentle and welcoming man who looked at me with wide eyes that I assumed were telling me a painful story.

I visited a homebound teenager in a wheelchair. He read lots of comic books. His horses outside were beautiful and he knew each horse's name and personality. I'm not certain that he enjoyed my visits, and yet he would always ask me when I was coming back.

Making connections with the homebound is important to us as a community of faith. If you or somebody you know has had a change in their health and needs communion or prayer, we ask that you let us know. We are a caring community and we want to make sure that people know they are loved by God and by their church.

For anyone who is homebound and has a need for pastoral care or communion, you can make a request for a visit by contacting Connie in the church office. Please call during office hours, which are Monday through Thursday from 8:00 a.m.-Noon. If you need to call outside of office hours, please make sure to leave a message on the voicemail. Once your request is received, it will be forwarded to one of the pastors who will be in contact to set up a time for a visit. We need your help in letting us know of your needs so we can offer care.

Wednesday Night Connect



Wednesday Night Connect (WNC) is a midweek ministry at Trinity Lutheran that seeks to help people of all ages grow in their relationship with God and one another. We will be restarting WNC on Wednesday, September 13, and it's open to anyone in the congregation, their friends, or others who are looking to make a faith connection.

Here is a run-down of what to expect for WNC. First, we start off with food and fellowship from **5:15 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.,** which is designed to relieve some of the pressures on families related to preparing dinner and getting everything ready to come to WNC. While the mealtime starts at 5:15 p.m., it is also flexible, so come whenever you can get here. Just make sure it's before 6:00 p.m. There is no cost for the meal.

It is important to note that we want to use the mealtime to build relationships. It is where we can take time to visit with people in our church family. We will be recommending some fun and simple ways to encourage everyone to get to know each other.

At **6:00 p.m.**, we will transition from the Fellowship Hall to the Worship Space for a large group time. The large group time has elements of worship, but is also very different than a typical Sunday morning service experience. During large group, we have singing, prayers, a Bible reading and a short teaching for the evening. The teaching time will take various forms and uses skits, activities, videos, and conversation. The large group time will be 25-30 minutes.

After the large group time, we will offer a few age-based groups. Assemble School Kits

We are still looking for items to fill the kits. (We have plenty of erasers at this time.) Purchase any of the items listed below and drop off in closet number 2 in the Fellowship Hall or Office.

Each kit includes:

- FOUR 70-sheet notebooks of wide or college-ruled paper, approximately 8" x 10 ½"; no loose-leaf paper (ONLY 70 sheet, no other size, so all the same).
- ONE 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with

centimeters on one side & inches on the other.

- ONE pencil sharpener.
- ONE pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well).
- FIVE unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers.
- FIVE black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink).
- ONE box of 16 or 24 crayons.
- ONE 2 ¹/₂" eraser (<u>no</u> erasers needed).
- ONE sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag.
