## Empty Tomb Cross + Gen Event

Did you know that kids need 5 adults in their life guiding them and giving input. I know for me, I sometimes need at least 2 people to help me pick out my outfit. Imagine a decision like who to date or where to go to college? That might

take a few people who care about you to help give some input. Kids also need 5 caring adults to know their hopes and dreams... 5 people who know their quirks and good points... 5 people

they can talk to honestly about what's really going on in their lives... 5 people who can offer wisdom when life gets confusing... 5 people who care about them and pray for them. (*"Why Your Kids Need Five Other Adults in Their Lives"* - Carey Nieuwhof)

In a time when young people (and the not so young, too) are feeling more disconnected than ever... this idea of having 5 caring adults becomes even more important. And its not just the kids. It's the adults too. Adults need to be known... we, too, need to have people care about our hopes and dreams... our quirks and good points... people who pray for us. We, too need to be in relationships with others of all ages and stages.

We use "Cross+Gen" rather than "intergenerational" because putting the cross in the middle of the generations and making it the conduit seems symbolically pretty powerful.

A friend of mine who is 20 is always reminding me that I'm too hard on myself and that I can let some stuff go. She has a wisdom that I appreciate. And when it comes to medical questions or "am I ruining my children" there

are a couple 80+ year olds I get on the phone with right away. And when I am not looking for it, I glean love for Jesus from those who can barely spell his name.

This year we have been intentional about building faith-filled relationships across the generations. We call them Cross+Gen Events. We use "Cross+Gen" rather than "intergenerational" because putting the cross in the middle of the generations and making it the conduit seems symbolically pretty powerful. We worship, share, read scripture, pray and bless one another. We will gather on May 15th at 5:30pm with a puppet show in worship to highlight our Empty Tomb theme. Then, after worship we will move into the fellowship hall where we honor our oldest and our youngest, and celebrate all the ages in between.

## Thoughts on Christ in the Passover

The evening of April 8th here at Trinity, almost 70 of us had the privilege to listen to a presentation by Jews for Jesus, entitled, **“Christ in the Passover.”** I was, perhaps, especially open to their presentation in large part due to my participation in the **“Read the Bible in 90 Days”** program being led by Pastor Tim.

So much of what I know about the Bible has been learned over a life time. Re-reading the Bible in a short period of time consolidates the story line into a more concise overview. So far we have read the Old Testament and have started the New Testament including the Gospels, the writing of Luke, and now the letters of Paul.

We have read that God made a covenant with Abraham that his descendants would be a blessing to all nations. The Exodus story told us of the Passover, deliverance to the promised land, the failure of Israel to love their God, the multiple dispersions of the people as punishment for this failure, and finally the arrival and presence of Jesus.

With this as a backdrop, last **night we were given a “taste”** of the Seder meal from the perspective of a Jewish woman who was

raised in a Jewish home and celebrated Passover as part of her heritage. The presenters read in Hebrew, sang parts of the Seder in Hebrew, but at the same time shared how Jesus is the **culmination of God’s promise to Abraham.**



As I read the Old Testament story I often resisted the constant blame placed on women

from the Garden of Eden, by the choice of Jewish men in their selection of, and use of women. I struggle with why men are not more to blame. So I was delighted when the presenter shared how it is the women of the house who lights the candles for the start of the Seder meal. She pointed out that Jesus was born of a woman, and He is the Light of the World.

Many parts of the meal were discussed to include the role of children. What I was most struck by, however, was how they portrayed the use of Matzoh. It has many small holes, no yeast because yeast equals sin, and has stripes, just as Jesus was without sin, was pierced and whipped (left with stripes). There were other examples of Jewish tradition in the Seder that point to

Jesus but this symbolism was most significant to me.

In a very real way this Jewish **woman fulfills God’s promise** that the children of Abraham would be a blessing to all nations.

## Help Create Baby Care Kits

In 2018 we included: 980 hand-made diapers; 490 blankets; 490 bars of soap; 980 safety pins; 490 pairs of socks; 245 hand towels; plus shirts, pants, sleepers and jackets in the kits that were sent to Lutheran World Relief.

## Trinity Softball Team

### Toilet Available For Donation

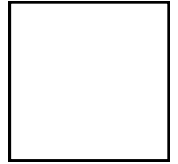
