

FAMILY FAITH NIGHT

Family Faith Night is a time to share a meal, sing, pray, have fun and be inspired as our faith is strengthened. This is an evening for anyone in the community to connect with one another and grow in faith together.

We will start the evening by offering an open meal time from 5:15—5:50 pm in the Fellowship Hall. There is no charge for the meal. Sharing a meal is a great time to enjoy fellowship with one another, and we hope it will make participating in Wednesday nights easier for people coming from all different directions (work, school, sports etc.). Following the meal we will move into the worship center for a time of singing, prayer and worship from 6:00—6:25pm. After this large group worship time we will offer faith formation break out groups for various ages. Examples of break out groups would be things like: Music group practice, Godly Play (for kids 4k—3rd grade), W45 (for those in 4th—5th grade),

Middle School Group (for the fall it will be confirmation), Adult Groups such as book study, prayer group, Living Your Strengths or other intentional groups.

Once per month we all stay together for a Cross+Gen experience.

We begin the year on **Wednesday September 4**, with registration for youth. The faith formation groups begin the following week.

One area that has a particular need on Wednesdays will be for **Kitchen Crew helpers.** The kind of help we need is very simple. It would entail being part of a group that helps serve the meal and clean up—

Providing the meal involves:

- Providing the food (paying for it—but if you need assistance, please see Marina Benoy in the office).
- Preparing the food in the NATH kitchen (or other location). It may be easier to bring food already cooked.
- Dinner estimate is

- around 20-24 which includes residents, staff and yourselves.
- Provide two gallons of milk (could also include lemonade).
- Provide volunteers to prep and serve (limit 2-4 at NATH).
- Food is served "buffet style". Dinner should be ready at 5:30 pm.
- Please plan to eat with the residents and enjoy a time of fellowship with them.
- Whoever signed up at the IOC Table as

"Contact" will coordinate dinner with others who signed up.

• Two or three days prior, the office receives an email with the head count at NATH-informing us as well if there are babies or any food allergies. The office will forward this info to the contact person.

If you enjoy cooking, please consider getting a group of friends together to plan and serve a meal on Sept. 10, Oct. 8, Nov. 12, or Dec. 10.

Blessing of the Quilts

Join us Sunday, September 29th at the 9:30 am worship for the quilt blessing.

Pastor Kari and Pastor Tim will be blessing the quilts that have been created all year by WELCA quilters before sending them off to Lutheran World Relief.

Imagine the comfort and care you feel when you snuggle under a comforter made by a loved one. That's the feeling that is shared through a Lutheran World Relief Mission Quilt. Useful for shielding against the cold and rain or for warm bedding, quilts can also be purposed as simple tents, floor coverings, or a wrap to hold a baby on a mother's back. In a simple combination of fabric and thread, our Trinity Lutheran WELCA quilters reach out to people in their time of need with a strong message of hope—you are not alone.

The first Monday and Tuesday of each month, quilters gather from 9 am to 3 pm measuring, cutting fabric, sewing and tying 60" by 80" quilts that are packed and stored for shipment until fall. Last year 701 quilts were made and shipped to Lutheran World Relief for distribution!

Do you enjoy sewing and fellowship? If you would like to share your gifts in this way, please contact Connie Griesbach, Virginia Randolph or Pam Karoliussen in the church office.

If sewing is not your talent, the quilters are always in need of large pieces of fabric, sheets, curtains, or light-weight bedspreads for backing the quilts. Monetary donations are also welcome to purchase the large rolls of quilt batting. You may write a check to WELCA noting the money is to be used for quilts.

It's not just all work and no play, fellowship abounds at breaks and potluck lunches on quilting days in the Fellowship Hall at Trinity.

From the Council President

Greetings,

Last fall we held a council retreat where we took an honest look at the ministry here at Trinity, and while it is clear God is blessing us, we still face many challenges. We began work on the WIG - Wildly Important Goal. A goal essential to carrying out our mission and ministry.

We came to the consensus that our governance structure (the system) was our largest threat. Since the retreat, we've been evaluating how we function and those things that are hampering our ministry. As a council we've been as transparent as possible throughout this process. We've met with all the boards and the staff. We've held a joint council meeting with all available board members. We've written articles in the newsletter and given updates in worship. And we have embraced the "TEST AND LEARN" environment that the VISIONING AND PLANNING report suggested.

The Board of Education had an episode several years ago that saw three members resign. Since that time, Jody Doro has chaired that board and has been working closely with Pr. Kari. They have functioned as a committee, finding appropriate help when needed, and are succeeding in their efforts. The council has asked Jody to stay on beyond his term limit to (test and learn) how this type of committee system will benefit Trinity.

One month after this decision, the Board of Worship, embracing this concept, laid out a similar proposal and a simpler way of operating using more short-term committees and a person whose skills and passion for such work will continue to serve beyond her term limit as well, Sue Underberg.

In addition, the council implemented a motion that was made in 2006 to aid communication and direction for the boards. The board chairs will be the council representatives. A behavioral covenant has been instituted for the entire council and we are exploring extending that to the boards as well. We will continue to elect the executive team as the constitution states and observe the term limits.

The spirit is alive and active at Trinity, and we ask for patience as we explore new opportunities and seek a more productive way of living out our mission statement and carrying out our Ministry.


