A look at a recent sermon by Jim Hohman.

Before going on vacation Pastor Kari had a sermon entitled "**What if everybody did that?**" She was speaking in part about the idea of a tithe, but the theme came back to me repeatedly over the next several weeks.

Recently, on "To The Best Of Our Knowledge," Wisconsin Public Radio had a program on Original Sin. One of the participants (Danielle Shroyer, A Blessing In The Garden) spoke about her book on the concept of Original Blessing rather than Original sin. I must admit that I have never fully embraced the concept of original sin, so the idea of original blessing is very attractive to me. She argues that we should walk in this idea rather than just our need for doing something about our sinful nature. We need to see all the good in the

world as the gift of a Blessing from God. What if everybody did that?

I listened to a program on the 50th anniversary of Woodstock. One of the original hippies who performed at the concert said he is still a hippy. He explained that they believed in loving rather than hating, working for peace rather than war, and seeking to care for their fellow man, rather than self. What if everybody did that?

Greetings friends!



Greetings,

I've always been interested in this story from scripture, and it was one of the texts from a recent Sunday. From Exodus: Moses is working as the judge for the people of Israel, basically doing it all himself. His father-in-law comes to visit and finds him overwhelmed and offers him advice on how to delegate much of the responsibility and effort. This makes for a healthier community and a healthier Moses.

We have been spending time looking at how we function here at Trinity and have found many of our volunteers are overwhelmed and frustrated. They are not always clear on their roles and responsibilities and often feel like they are wasting their time and effort. We also have found that many times good people are not using their God given talents or are in a role that is not in line with their strengths. As a result of this revelation, we are trying some new ways to function.

We now have two boards that are operating as committees, using volunteers when needed and seeking out individuals with specific strengths for certain tasks.

We are also realizing that volunteers are more willing to work on shorter projects or tasks so they don't feel like they are locked into the 2-4 year board commitment.

And using tools like the Living Your Strengths survey and classes, we are better positioned to help volunteers find the best fit in the many opportunities we have to serve.

This tools also helps us identify leaders we may have overlooked. Our new Vice President was found in a Living Your Strengths class. His input and effort on Council has been a breath of fresh air!

God is truly at work in our congregation, that is for certain. Please continue to pray for and have patience with our efforts to position our congregation to be a place where people of all ages can become active and engaged followers of Christ well into the future.


