All Saints Sunday is a time to remember and give thanks for those in our congregation who have gone before us. We will be observing All Saints Day at our Sunday Worship Service on November 3 at 9:30 am. As part of the worship service we will read the names of Trinity Lutheran's brothers and sisters who have died in the faith this past year. As each name is read we will light a candle to remember life that was lived with us and also to proclaim the hope we all share in Christ's resurrection.

We will also invite the congregation to come forward in the service to light a candle in remembrance of someone who has died. The lit candles are placed in sandboxes next the baptismal font. This is a strong reminder of the promise we receive in baptism of God's deliverance and entrance into God's eternal family.

Though we celebrate that in Christ God has conquered the power of death, we still live with death and the

many griefs we must bear in life. The loss of a loved one can bring up many different thoughts, emotions and even tears. Sometimes these tears can be ones of sadness such as those times when we miss their presence with us. Other times our tears can be ones of joy when we recall how thankful we are for the impact our loved one had on our life.

As we observe All Saints Day, the significance of our own baptism becomes prominent. We have been called forth from death to life and become part of God's redeeming work for all creation. As we light candles in our worship service we are reminded that Jesus is the light of the world. In Him we have received grace upon grace to go forth and shine his light in the dark corners of the world.

May this be a time of sharing our griefs, experiencing the comfort of God's presence and celebrating the hope of Christ's resurrection.

Our congregation is a covenant sponsor for Pastor Rachel Eskesen and her husband Pastor Zachary Courter. Pastor Rachel and Pastor Zachary serve as coordinators for the ELCA Young Adults in Global Mission Program in Hungary and Serbia, guiding young adults as they serve, and cultivating them to be

future leaders in the ELCA and the world. They are also strengthening relationships with the Lutheran Church in Hungary,

diaconal ministries there, and NGO's working to dismantle Anti-Gypsism in Central Europe. Here is a note from our missionaries this month:

Greetings friends! The week before last, Zach and I helped organize and lead a conference with our colleagues here in Budapest.

Here is a short summary of what happened at the conference: From Sept. 30th to October 4th, Zach and Rachel helped lead a Study

Session on Volunteering as a tool for Roma inclusion in society sponsored by the Council of Europe. The main leader of the study session was our partner organization Phiren Amenca. Phiren Amenca is a network that promotes Roma rights and inclusion in Europe and the world by creating opportunities from Roma and non-Roma young people to get to know one another.

The foundation of the study session was human rights. Focus was given to how racism against Roma people (antigypsyism) violates the human rights



of Roma, and how strengthening the volunteer networks of Roma throughout Europe will lead to less antigypsims as greater exposure and understanding of Roma culture occurs.

It was an amazing week with some incredible participants and leaders. We were grateful to have the opportunity to participate!

Connecting Faith, Family & Friends

Family Faith Night is a new ministry this year to help support faith formation for all generations.

Nine years ago the Wednesday evening programming underwent some significant changes. We expanded from just Confirmation Class on Wednesday night to including a worship service. Our original goal was to offer a worship experience for those who could not attend on Sunday morning or who were looking for a different worship format. What happened is that families responded to this worship opportunity. The day and time just seems to fit with families' busy schedules. The Wednesday worship service has grown from 30-40 when we started to now 80-90 attending each week. Thanks be to God.

One of the things that parents expressed is the struggle to find time to get their kids fed while coming from work, attending worship and going to faith formation opportunities on Wednesday night. This struggle was creating an obstacle for many families to fully participate. The summertime was used to re-envision what Wednesday night could look like and meet the need parents were expressing. Through deliberate prayer and dreaming Family Faith Night emerged.

Family Faith Night is not a new concept. Many other churches have been using this approach for years. It

starts by offering a meal followed by some kind of evening programming. This fall we took a step of faith and began offering an open meal time. The way it works is that we take turns preparing and serving the meal and cleaning up. Right now we have been asking the team to cover the cost of the meal. One way we make this happen is by having several people provide different parts of the meal, someone brings the desert, someone the salad, someone the main course. This approach is an expansion of what has been happening on Wednesday nights for years. We will continue to monitor how it is working and look to make adjustments along the way.

While we are targeting families at Family Faith Night it is crucial to point out that this night is for ANYONE in our community that wants to connect with others and grow in faith together. With this in mind, the meal time is an integral part of what we are hoping to accomplish on Wednesday nights. We want to support and connect people to their faith, their family and friends. We are blessed by the help of many different groups in our congregation to help make this engaging ministry happen.







Growing Through Our Gratitude

We discover the joyful and faithful response to God's gift of grace in Christ.

During the month of October we began year two of our stewardship initiative First We Give Of Ourselves. The theme for this year is "Giving in Gratitude." Through devotions, faith talks, Bible Studies, sermons and worship we have been exploring God's blessings, what it means to respond to them and how we can be a blessing to others.

We are thankful for these stories and many others that speak about the impact of the vibrant ministry we are blessed with at Trinity Lutheran. Let's continue to grow.

Soup For Shelter


Everyone is welcome to attend the Annual Rhinelander Soup for Shelter on **Saturday, November 9** being held this year at Nativity of our Lord Church on King St. Proceeds will go to Frederick Place, the temporary emergency shelter operated by NATH.

Doors will open at 5 pm to purchase basket raffle tickets. Admission is by free will donation. Area restaurants will be donating a variety of delicious soups.

Frederick Place offers emergency shelter for families and individuals from Forest, Langlade, Lincoln, Oneida and Vilas Counties. The annual operating costs for the shelter in 2019 are just over \$285,484 which include 24-hour staff salaries, case management, food, utilities, supplies, insurance, equipment, and maintenance. We have housed over 721 unduplicated individuals since opening the doors on Jan. 31, 2011.

Come enjoy a wonderful soup supper and have fun as you support those who are experiencing homelessness in our Northwoods area.


