

## **BEING MISSIONAL**

For the past year Trinity has embraced the concept of Small Groups. We have groups who meet weekly and groups who meet monthly totaling 11 groups. These groups have sermonbased discussions while taking the time to check in with each other and pray for one another. In the past year members of these groups have gone through major life events together including: weddings, funerals, graduations, new babies, adoptions, cancer, surgery.... One small group leader said to me, "Being in a small group is exactly what I needed to get through the last year, I just didn't know how much I would need it."

This new year, as we think about lifting weights or eating our vegetables, we also should think about getting into spiritual shape. We don't do that by depriving ourselves of what we really want but instead by giving ourselves exactly what we need—community. We are at a point in history where we are the most connected we have ever been and yet many are more depressed and its happening younger and younger. We can blame the cell phone or social media, but those things have entered our culture

and aren't going anywhere. The remedy isn't to eliminate technology but is about BEING MISSIONAL and intentionally having face-to-face conversations that challenge us to think about how God is working in the world around us. When was the last time that you prayed for somebody or have someone pray for you? Wouldn't it be amazing to be in relationships with other Christians who say, "How can we pray for you tonight and this week?"

As a pastor, I see people at times of trauma, transition and celebration. And I want to be there in those times, but what about a "Tuesday"? A regular day when you are just having trouble balancing work and family and all the pressure? Your small group is a group of friends who get to know you and are able to be there to support you on a regular day when there isn't anything major but you just want to know that you are not alone.

This January, talk to Pastor Kari about joining a Small Group. We have existing groups that will open up to invite new group members in as continued on page 4

We are the brand new Juedes'. Pastor Kari married us in October! As a couple we live in Rhinelander and have a




cottage in Tomahawk that we plan on making our fulltime home.

## Our Stewardship Initiative

## Our giving is done first, as a joyful and faithful response to God's gift of grace in Christ.

Trinity Lutheran is in the midst of a three year Stewardship initiative called, "First We Give of Ourselves." This year's emphasis is "Giving in Gratitude". During October we kicked off the year with a four week sermon series on our theme with devotions, Bible Studies and a commitment celebration.

One of our biggest goals in this initiative is to shift the conversation about stewardship from one that understands stewardship simply as a fund raising activity to fulfill a budget, to one that is centered in and through God's abundant grace in Christ. This is proving to be a big goal to works towards. It is so easy to slip into the "bill paying" mindset.

One of the questions we have looked at is whether our stewardship efforts make a difference for the ministry of our congregation. Are we helping people as they follow Christ? Here are some highlights of our initiative and the impact it is having thus far:

- 278 households were sent a *Plan for Giving* Card invitation this year.
- 43% of the households returned a *Plan* for Giving Card.
- Of those who had a Plan for Giving last year, 96% of plans were fulfilled.
- Last year we received 81% of our income from those who made a *Plan for Giving*.

One of the things that these numbers indicate is that by asking people to fill out a Plan for Giving Card it helps them fulfill their stewardship goals. While we never specify an amount a Christ follower should give, that is always between them and God, we do ask that they be intentional in their stewardship plans. So, another one of our stewardship goals is to increase the number of our members who participate in this Plan for Giving process.

It is amazing to see how these intentional plans positively impact our ministry. A major portion of our income comes from those who have made a Plan for Giving. And what is even more exciting is to see how faithful our members are in fulfilling their plans. Thanks be to God and thank you to all our members for your generosity.

Looking ahead the Stewardship Committee is working to implement a year-round emphasis. One thing to be looking for is an invitation to consider Simply Giving (see note on side column). Many of our members have found this a helpful tool for their giving.

Grace is the foundational reason why we give. In Christian stewardship, giving is not centered on the budget or what is needed for it to balance. Nor is our giving centered on the need of the day. That is simply fund raising. Rather, our giving is based on the cross of Christ and the abundance of God's grace. God's grace envelops all of who we are in Christ. The most precious gift we can receive for our lives is God's life giving and life changing grace in Christ. Our giving is a thankful response to God' love for us.

## Proceeding on Relationship Enhancement Project

#### Project information meetings are Sundays January 12 & 19

Have you had the challenge of making your way through the Gathering Area after a worship service? On the one hand it is exciting to see so many people taking time to greet each other and share in meaningful conversations. On the other hand it can be really difficult to enjoy being in the cramped space. Here at Trinity the council and the board of property have been looking at ways we can better use our available space while seeking to enhance the ministry that is happening here.

In January of 2014 & 2017 we invited ELCA Building Consultant Pat Dever, and then Anne Gerreits, to Trinity to help us look at our facility needs. They met with both the council and the board of property members. They affirmed what we were doing with our fellowship time and gave us some additional information to guide our process of enhancing this ministry.

Here is the information they provided:

The Gathering Area ideally is located directly adjacent to the worship space.

It performs two primary functions: it is where we most effectively meet and greet the visitor and it is where we nurture and care for one another.

The atmosphere should be warm and bright and allow people to visit. This is where the coffee fellowship is held before, between or after worship to encourage building community with members and visitors.

Visitors will not typically attend coffee/fellowship in more remote parts of the building. Thresholds are bar-



riers to visitors as they have already used up their risk tolerance for the morning. Current high tables ("cocktail-type tables") are great! Round tables with seating tend to look exclusive and exclude newcomers. Standing and milling as at a cocktail party is what you want. You've got 20 minutes or less to greet most people.

The Gathering Area also becomes the communication center where people can learn of activities and events being offered within the congregation and the community. Some congregations have staffed information centers where questions can be answered and information obtained.

There should be signage in this area, and throughout the building, which provides directions to the offices, restrooms, nursery, classrooms and other areas. The recommended place for directional signs is hung from the ceiling or extending from the walls with letters big enough to be read from a distance.

The Building Consultant made several recommenda-

tions to meet our the fellowship space needs. The Board of Property acted on the recommendations to add signage in the entryway and Gathering space. They also added fire door openers to the lower level and painted. We also noticed some factors that are limiting the relational ministry that continue to this day.

The council has been talking about addressing these limiting factors for the past five years and has a plan to take action this year. The Board of Property has expressed the need to replace the carpet in the Gathering Area for several years It is almost 20 years old and has served us well especially in such a high traffic area. So the time is right to work on enhancing this area of our ministry.

In January the council will be holding information meetings to share the scope of the project to enhance our relational ministry. Information meetings will be Sundays January 12 & 19 after the 9:30am worship service in the Fellowship Hall. We look forward enhancing our relational ministry.
