

<u>Session 2 – Abide Like Spaghetti.</u> Noodles are smothered, covered and abide in a red sauce all tangled up together. So no matter how noodley life gets, you can eat spaghetti and be reminded that God's love smothers, covers and abides in you.

On the Menu: Spaghetti. Additional Supplies: Bible and Small Catechism.

<u>Share</u>:

⇒ Share Highs and Lows. (Take your time here.)

Video Based Discussion:

- \Rightarrow **Connection to the Bible:** John 15:4-5
- ⇒ "Abide" means "stay" or "remain." Why is it important for a dog to sit or stay? What does it mean to stay with Jesus? How might the two be connected?
- ⇒ What do these verses say about how God abides in us? Is there anywhere we can go where God cannot?
- ⇒ There is nothing that can separate us from God's love. God will always abide in us no matter what. Pandemics, politics—nothing can separate us from God—just like spaghetti and sauce are inseparable after being united.
- \Rightarrow **Connection to Luther's Small Catechism:** The Sacrament of the Altar (pages 33-34).
- ⇒ "Given for you" and "shed for you" tells us that the promises of God are for us and when we take in the body and blood we are united with God and strengthened for a life of faith with one another.

<u>Make</u>: Make a meme about how it feels that God's love lives inside you. Email it to PK or post it on social media to remind others that God abides in them too. —————OR———— If you have a dog, make a video of yourself asking your dog to sit, stay, or whatever tricks s/he can do.

<u>Prayer</u>: Go for a prayer walk. Notice where God abides all around you. How does God abide in you? Give thanks for the things you see and feel.
